Group show, seven Korean artists

Seven artists, seven singular glances, one silent breath.

Hoon Moreau | Hyunjoo Choi | Hyunjoo Hong | Hong Ilhwa | Inhyuck Park | Woojung Park | Moon Chang Dawn

Through sculptures, furniture, and wall pieces, these artists explore the intimate relationship between space, matter, and perception. Their creations invite a sensitive dialogue with time and silence, where the simplicity of the forms opens up an emotional and poetic depth. In this balance between Korean tradition and contemporary expression, each work offers a meditative experience: that of an inner resonance, discreet yet lasting.

The exhibition «Silent Resonance» was born from a desire to explore what art can convey without noise, without spectacular effects, but with an inner force that imposes itself on those who know how to stop and observe.

The works of Hoon Moreau, Hyunjoo Choi, Hyunjoo Hong, Hong Ilhwa, Inhyuck Park, Moon Chang Dawn, and Woojung Park share a sensitivity that transcends matter, a subtle approach to gesture and gaze, where every detail, every texture, every empty space carries a profound meaning.

Through this gathering of Korean artists, the aim is not to confine a cultural identity to forms or techniques, but to reveal an attitude toward the world: an extreme attention to the passing of time, the fragility of the moment, the balance of forces, and the beauty of impermanent things.

«Silent Resonance» is an invitation to suspend judgment, slow down, and allow ourselves to be moved by the discreet echo that each work evokes within us. An encounter between the visible and the invisible, between the gallery space and the intimate space of perception.


At the heart of contemporary Korean art lies a unique relationship with silence, space, and time, rooted in an aesthetic thought deeply rooted in the culture of emptiness and the ephemeral.

This group exhibition highlights a shared approach, where art seeks not so much to represent as to suggest. Silence is not an absence, but a breath, a subtle vibration, a latent presence. It evokes the Korean concept of «Sunyeo,» a form of inner calm where contemplation allows one to perceive beauty beyond appearances.


The seven artists gathered here cultivate a delicate tension between nature and abstraction, tradition and modernity, matter and emptiness. Their works reflect a sensibility specific to Korean culture, inherited from Confucianism, Zen Buddhism, and a relationship with nature where humanity is invited to step back before the essential simplicity of things.

«Silent Resonance» thus questions the Western gaze, often captivated by the spectacular, by offering a more meditative, slower experience, where the work is as much a breathing space as it is a visual object.






























Hoon Moreau

An architect and designer by training, Hoon Moreau develops an artistic practice situated at the intersection of sculptural design and organic abstraction. His work questions the intimate relationship between nature and objects, exploring notions of balance, fluidity, and harmony. His sculptural works, refined and sensitive, reflect a quest for the essential and a reflection on inhabited space.




Hyunjoo Choi





Hyunjoo Hong


Hyunjoo Hong creates a body of work that is both contemplative and introspective, where the repetition of gestures and the delicacy of textures reflect an intense focus on the creative process. Her compositions, often characterized by silent rhythms and a calming palette, invite the viewer to slow down and immerse themselves in a visual meditation experience.




Hilhwa Hong



OAK Gallery is the new landmark for art and design collectors in Toulouse.

Galerie OAK is located at 2 Place Moutoulieu in Toulouse, in the former kitchens of a listed 14th-century residence. This new location is a showcase for inspiring displays featuring works of art selected by Antoine Vignault and pieces from the 1950s, 1960s, and 1970s, patiently sourced by Emmanuelle Vidal.

Brought together by their shared passion for collectible design and unique pieces, Emmanuelle Vidal and Antoine Vignault have been exhibiting since 2020 in a magnificent apartment opposite the Jardin des Plantes. Since last March, they have been presenting their selections in a new 80m² showroom on Place Montoulieu, where all the art and design pieces are staged and offered for sale. These rare, often unique, objects are presented during thematic exhibitions that highlight artists from all walks of life. The decor is constantly evolving, according to their discoveries and the favorites of customers, more and more of whom are discovering this new address.

This eclectic showroom also features a selection of furniture, lighting, and rare objects from the second half of the 20th century, sourced by Emmanuelle Vidal. Signed by the most famous designers (Pierre Paulin, Alain Richard, Pierre Guariche, Gio Ponti, Angelo Mangiarotti, Paul McCobb, Gaetano Pesce, Marc Newson, André Dubreuil...), these pieces are enhanced by the patina of time or restored with passion by craftsmen. More up-to-date than ever, this resolutely modern selection demonstrates the perfect blend of aesthetics and functionality in French, Italian, and Scandinavian design from the 1950s to the 1970s.

The O Δ K Toulouse gallery is open Wednesday through Saturday from 2 p.m. to 7 p.m.
